Every year the Cross Country season sneaks up on me in mid-August, while I'm feeling like the summer just began. And it continues on at a relentless pace for several furious weeks, until I'm sure that winter is right around the corner. The whole season is really only 11 or 12 weeks, but it seems like so many things change during that time. Maybe, most noticeable, is the weather.

Every season has its ups and downs, and interesting things always happen. One of the more interesting "downs" for the boys team happened before the season really got going. One of our returning letter-men, Nathan Hills, after putting in a great summer of running, tore ligaments in his knee and was out for the season. We had 15 other boys on the team, including several promising new athletes, but our Boys Team struggled much of the year. Depth is an important feature of most Cross Country Teams, and our Boy's Team lacked that. One of our major goals for the future is recruiting young athletes into our program.

Bright spots for the Boys this season would have to be the continued improvements of many of our "rookie" runners. Freshman, Noah Brown, showed us right away that he would be one to watch this year as he placed 4<sup>th</sup> in the Freshman race at the 20-Team Kenosha Tremper Invite in late August. He continued to move up the ranks until, by the end of the season he was our #2 Varsity runner. Sophomores A. J. Rich and Lance Klaty, and Junior Adam Shea also made big gains during the season, and were able to contribute on the Varsity level. Many other young athletes showed marked improvements throughout the season, and should be primed for moving up next year.

The Girl's Team had its share of positives and negatives during the season. Over all, the season was very successful, with solid Team finishes and high Individual places most of the year. The Girl's team had 24 runners this year, with most of its Letter-winners returning from last season's Conference Championship Team, and several talented new-comers joining the ranks. The Girls won the Dodge County Invitational and the Franklin Invitational, and took a 2<sup>nd</sup> place trophy in the Kettle Moraine Invite. These were high-lights early in the season. And it seemed that each week we were getting contributions from new Girls on the Varsity squad, or outstanding efforts from some of the J.V. Girls. Freshmen, Maddie Houston and Emilee Brackenbury, and Sophomores Lauren McVey and Katie Jaeger all ran in at least one Varsity race this year. Some of the negatives for the Girls team this year would be the 3<sup>rd</sup> Place finish in the Conference Meet, after last year's win, and not being able to qualify the team for the State Meet. Some meets our Girls were a bit inconsistent, and couldn't get 5 solid finishes in the same race. But, with all of our varsity Girls returning for next year, hopefully any missed opportunities from this season will provide motivation for the next one.

As far as individual highlights for the year, there were quite a few. Lots of girls earned medals in most of the meets we participated in. The most highly sought after hardware comes from the Conference Meet and beyond. We had 3 girls earn medals this year in the Wisconsin Little Ten Conference Championship Meet. Abby Reier placed 9<sup>th</sup> and Carly Hall placed 14<sup>th</sup> to earn 2<sup>nd</sup>-Team All-Conference medals. And Mandy Prom was the overall Conference Champion to earn 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Conference honors, and also was selected as the Runner of the Year in the WLT. Mandy won 6 races this year, and also qualified for the State Meet as an Individual. She saved her best race for the last meet of the season when she placed 9<sup>th</sup> in the WIAA Division I State Meet at Wisconsin Rapids on Saturday, October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2009. She finished the race in a new School Record Time of 14:58.9, and earned 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-State recognition for her efforts.

As each year comes to a close, we reflect on what's past, and we look forward to the next year. What can we do to get better and to be more successful in the future? We have to continue to promote our sport and to work to get more athletes involved. This summer the coaches hope to put together a Cross Country/ Endurance Camp early in the summer. We also look forward to having all of our returning athletes take an active part in the Camp, and in helping to recruit new athletes into our sport. As usual, we hope all of our runners will continue to train throughout the year and through the summer months in order to come into next year with high hopes and an expectation of great success. Next year we will be hosting a Cross Country Invitational at Nature Hill Intermediate School on Thursday, September 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2010. We look forward to the continued support of all of our athletes and parents for this new and exciting undertaking.
